Structural changes in the sector have led to a willingness to explore the advantages of cities outside of London and Cardiff has been one of the main beneficiaries of this. Walk around our city and you will see it for yourself. Flagship city centre developments home to a fast-growing number of international legal and financial companies, including both retail and challenger banks, are leading the way in defining Cardiff as a key business sector in the UK.

It's not just about Cardiff's lower cost base in comparison with London. Our post-COVID-19 response, world class talent availability, digital infrastructure, expertise in data management, transport connections, supportive ecosystem and pro-business attitude are key resilience factors. These advantages have led to the growth of a dynamic cluster with globally recognised financial and professional services headquartering in the city. Some of the UK's biggest accountancy and legal firms such as Deloitte and Legal & General have expanded their operations in Cardiff in recent years, cementing the city's reputation as a centre of legal and accounting expertise with great potential to efficiently scale operations.

In comparison with the UK's other Core Cities, a broad range of businesses within the professional services sector are represented here. Welsh government research states that Cardiff is the preferred location for contact and shared service centres in the UK with particular expertise in outsourced HR and personal and SME insurance.

Cardiff has also become known as an alternative FinTech capital and is a key location for digital innovation in InsureTech and RegTech.

Our city's financial and professional services sector is long established but innovative and outward-looking. Visit Cardiff and you will find a city embracing future business challenges.



Cardiff has firmly established itself as one of the foremost UK innovation hubs with a booming start-up sector.

Cardiff is one of the fastest growing digital economies outside of London which has led to an emergent world-class FinTech, RegTech and cyber security cluster. In the city and its Capital Region FinTech is a priority sector and you'll find companies specialising in innovative payment solutions, data analytics, blockchain, risk management, coding, open data compliance and digital identity.

The strong technical skills of our workforce combined with digital fluency are enabling the sector in Cardiff to transform and strengthen itself to meet the technological challenges of the coming decade. The city's tech ecosystem, supported by a highly entrepreneurial graduate population has given rise to a number of 'disruptive' companies which are changing the way we do business. Significantly 2018 /2019 saw the number of business start-ups in Cardiff increase by 8.3%, well above the UK average of 2% for the same period.

The sector is supported by FinTech Wales, set up in 2019 to empower FinTechs to global success. FinTech Wales helps new start-ups and scale-ups by connecting the sector's ecosystem, bringing together entrepreneurs, small, medium and large enterprises, tech suppliers, universities, higher and further education, schools and the public sector. 2021 has seen the launch of the 'FinTech Wales Foundry', a not-for-profit and non-equity accelerator programme that operates by pairing exciting FinTech companies with some of Wales' leading organisations.

Support is also available through Cardiff University's new FinTech Research Group which engages in industrially relevant research and provides expertise to the sector.

The city offers a wide range of co-working and collision spaces such as digital workspace Tramshed Tech, which is ideally suited to FinTech start-ups, providing the perfect environment for innovative talent interactions and collaborations. The Natwest Entrepreneur Accelerator based at the bank's Welsh HQ, offers a vibrant collaborative environment with access to the banking teams, supply chains and industry figureheads they know, providing even more opportunities to start-up and scale-up businesses in the city.

Cardiff is also home to innovative financial security organisations and companies providing software management solutions. They are supported by both the National Cyber Security Academy established by the University of South Wales and Welsh Government to develop the next generation of cyber security experts, and Cardiff University's National Software Academy which aims to address the national shortage of skilled programming and software engineering graduates in partnership with Welsh Government and industry leaders.

The sector is also supported by Cardiff University's Centre for Cyber Security Research, a leading UK academic research unit for cyber security analytics which focuses on the fusion of data science and artificial intelligence methods with interdisciplinary insights into cyber risk, threat intelligence, attack detection and situational awareness.

Cardiff is a long-established centre of legal expertise with a reputation for being forward-looking, accessible and highly skilled. It's a dynamic sector inhabited by global Top 100 law firms, a rich network of smaller law firms and a specialist Business and Property Court.

Leading the way in the city are international law firms BLM, CJCH, Eversheds Sutherland, Geldards and Lewis Silkin and Top 100 UK Law firms Blake Morgan, Clarke Willmott and Hugh James. The sector is broad and diverse with innovative firms like Capital Law delivering new legal business models.

Cardiff is the tenth largest city for the number of legal activities businesses in the UK (outside of London), and has a relatively high level of legal activities businesses and employees for a city of its size. Cardiff also ranks highly in terms of the number of legal activities employees per 10,000 of population.

Operating costs compare favourably to other leading legal centres with prestigious city centre grade A office rents at £25psf.

The sector is well-supported by the city's universities. Cardiff University's School of Law and Politics is renowned for its internationally excellent research and high quality teaching and the University of South Wales features regularly as a Top 50 UK Law School (Guardian League Tables). Alongside Cardiff Metropolitan University and CILex accredited Cardiff and Vale College, a ready skills pipeline is on the doorstep.



The city has also become a venue that the world's leading performers want to play and has recently hosted Beyoncé, the Rolling Stones, Ed Sheeran and Coldplay.



Road

Cardiff is located on the M4 motorway, linking the city to London, southern England and other cities in South Wales. Typically Heathrow Airport is easily reached in around two hours. The M50 / M5 motorways link Cardiff to the Midlands and the North of England with Birmingham just two hours away.

Rail

Cardiff has excellent train connections to the rest of the UK. Cardiff Central Station has direct twice-hourly services to central London with journey times of 1hr 46 minutes.

Cardiff has one of the largest urban rail networks in the UK outside London, with 89 rail stations linking the city to its Capital Region. The network is currently being upgraded with £1.bn of investment to electrify rail infrastructure across South Wales bringing the Capital Region even closer. More than half of the total population of Wales will be able to commute by rail to Cardiff city centre in less than an hour.

The city also has a Eurofreight terminal and is the main rail freight depot in Wales for European and world markets.

Air




